

## King Fire, posted September 25, 2014

As most of you are aware, the King Fire that began burning in Pollock Pines on September 13<sup>th</sup> has grown immensely, and the smoke has impacted the Lake Tahoe and Truckee region. While our local emergency services departments are carefully monitoring the situation, they do not believe there is a significant risk of the fire moving into our area at the current time (*as of the community briefing held 9/24/14*). However, they stress the importance of the ever-changing conditions, and urge everyone to be prepared in case it becomes necessary to address emergency needs.
